Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act (UCCJEA) Checklists in Wayne County

These instructions apply to all persons filing a Petition or Complaint under the Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act (UCCJEA) in Wayne County. All filings shall be made pursuant to the general instructions found on the Family Domestic/FOC Filing Instructions Page at the Third Circuit Court Website. Please note that all UCCJEA forms can be found on the Family Domestic/FOC Filing Forms Page at the Third Circuit Court Website.

In general, the UCCJEA, MCL 722.1101-722.1406, only governs out of state child-custody determinations, which means a judgment, decree, or other court order providing for legal custody, physical custody, or parenting time with respect to a child. The UCCJEA **does not** govern orders relating to child support or other monetary obligations. Instead, the Uniform Interstate Family Support Act (UIFSA), MCL 552.2101-552.2905, governs out of state child support orders. UIFSA matters cannot be combined with UCCJEA matters; a separate case is required. Please note that UIFSA filing instructions can be found on the Family Domestic/FOC Filing Instructions Page at the Third Circuit Court Website.

INSTRUCTIONS:

Option #1: If there is a previous child custody determination that was issued by another state or foreign country <u>AND</u> you want to <u>REGISTER</u> that out-of-state or foreign country's child custody determination, the party or attorney shall:

F	File the following documents to submit to the Court's jurisdiction:
	□ <u>UCCJEA Child Custody Coversheet [UCCJEA Form 10];</u>
	 Check box #2(a) on Coversheet to declare the intent to register an out-of-state or foreign country child custody determination.
	□ A <u>Verified Petition for Registration [UCCJEA Form 1]</u> ;
	□ A Confidential Case Inventory Form [SCAO Form MC 21];
	□ A <u>Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction Enforcement Act Affidavit [SCAO Form MC 416]</u> ;
	☐ A letter, petition, or other document requesting registration;
	☐ A certified copy of the out-of-state or foreign country child custody determination sought to be registered, and a statement under penalty of perjury that, to the best of the knowledge and belief of the person seeking registration, the child custody determination has not been modified;
	☐ Include the name and address of the person seeking registration and of each parent or person acting as a parent who has been awarded custody or parenting time in the child custody determination sought to be registered; AND
	□ (* OPTIONAL *) If the party filing for registration of the child custody determination wants their address to remain confidential and provide an alternate mailing address, they may file LICCIEA Form 11. Please note that this form MUST be notarized.

Option #2: If there is a previous child custody determination that was issued by another state or foreign country <u>AND</u> you want <u>IMMEDIATE ENFORCEMENT</u> (without a prior or simultaneous registration) of that out-of-state or foreign country's child custody determination, the party or attorney shall:

•	Pay the necessary fees and file the following documents to submit to the Court's jurisdiction:
	□ <u>UCCJEA Child Custody Coversheet [UCCJEA Form 10];</u>
	• Check box #2(b) on Coversheet to declare the intent to immediately enforce an out- of-state or foreign country child custody determination.
	□ A <u>Verified Petition for Immediate Enforcement [UCCJEA Form 9]</u> ;
	□ A Confidential Case Inventory Form [SCAO Form MC 21]:
	☐ A <u>Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction Enforcement Act Affidavit [SCAO Form MC 416]</u> ;
	☐ A Petition for Immediate Enforcement that explains why the Court should enforce the out-of-state or foreign country's order and return the children to the Petitioner;
	☐ A certified copy of the out-of-state or foreign country child custody determination sought to be enforced, and a statement under penalty of perjury that, to the best of the knowledge and belief of the person seeking enforcement, the statements being made are true;
	☐ Include the name and address of the person seeking enforcement and of each parent or person acting as a parent who has been awarded custody or parenting time in the child custody determination sought to be enforced; AND
	□ (*OPTIONAL*) If the party filing for immediate enforcement of the child custody determination wants their address to remain confidential and provide an alternate mailing address, they may file UCCJEA Form 11. Please note that this form MUST be notarized.

Option #3: If there is a previous child custody determination that was issued by another state or foreign country that was **PREVIOUSLY REGISTERED AND CONFIRMED WITH THIS COURT** AND YOU WANT TO ENFORCE that out-of-state or foreign country's child custody determination, the party or attorney shall:

Pay the necessary motion fee and file the following documents under the previously registered case number to submit to the Court's jurisdiction:
☐ A Motion to Reopen the Registration case for the purpose of enforcing the previously registered foreign judgment; and providing an explanation for why this Court should enforce the out of state or foreign country's order.
□ A <u>Verified Petition for Enforcement after Entry of Order Confirming Registration [UCCJEA Form 9a]</u> ;
□ A Confidential Case Inventory Form [SCAO Form MC 21];
☐ A <u>Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction Enforcement Act Affidavit [SCAO Form MC 416]</u> ;
☐ A certified copy of the out-of-state or foreign country child custody determination sought to be enforced, and a statement under penalty of perjury that, to the best of the knowledge and belief of the person seeking enforcement, the statements being made are true;
☐ Include the name and address of the person seeking enforcement and of each parent or person acting as a parent who has been awarded custody or parenting time in the child custody determination sought to be enforced; AND
□ (* OPTIONAL *) If the party filing for enforcement of the child custody determination wants their address to remain confidential and provide an alternate mailing address, they may file LICCIEA Form 11. Please note that this form MUST be notarized

Option #4: If there is a previous child custody determination that was issued by another state or foreign country <u>AND</u> you want to <u>MODIFY</u> that out-of-state or foreign country's child custody determination, the party or attorney shall:

•	Pay the necessary fees and file the following documents to submit to the Court's jurisdiction:
	□ UCCJEA Child Custody Coversheet [UCCJEA Form 10];
	• Check box #2(c) on Coversheet to declare the intent to modify the out-of-state or foreign country child custody determination.
	☐ Certificate on Behalf of Plaintiff Without Ex Parte Interim Order for Custody, Support, And-or-Parenting Time, OR Certificate on Behalf of Plaintiff With Ex Parte Interim Order for Custody, Support, And-or-Parenting Time;
	□ A Confidential Case Inventory Form [SCAO Form MC 21];
	□ A <u>Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction Enforcement Act Affidavit [SCAO Form MC 416]</u> ;
	□ A Complaint for Modification that meets the requirements set forth under the UCCJEA, alleging averments of this Court's jurisdiction over the children under MCL 722.1203(a) or (b), AND the necessary averments regarding modification of custody under Michigan's Child Custody Act, MCL 722.21-722.31;
	\square A certified copy of the out-of-state or foreign country child custody determination sought to be modified;
	☐ Include the name and address of the person seeking modification and of each parent or person acting as a parent who has been awarded custody or parenting time in the child custody determination sought to be modified; AND
	□ (* OPTIONAL *) If the party filing for modification of the child custody determination wants their address to remain confidential and provide an alternate mailing address, they may file UCCJEA Form 11. Please note that this form MUST be notarized.

• Petitioner must serve the Summons, a copy of the Complaint, and all attachments on the opposing party pursuant to the Michigan Court Rules. See MCR 3.214 (which provides that actions under the UCCJEA, MCL 722.1101 *et seq.*, are governed by the rules applicable to other civil actions, including MCR 2.102 and MCR 2.105).
